A VALENTINE FROM THE LISD STAFF TO OUR STUDENTS AND FAMILIES.

From our Superintendent, Dr. Carl Bruner

The occurrence of several cases of COVID-19 on Lopez last week, with the potential of a connection to our school, caused us to delay the start of kindergarten. This was disappointing for all those involved, yet we thought it best to exercise an abundance of caution.

Our community has been very successful in minimizing the number of COVID-19 infections, yet we have to assume that we will see infections in the future. We certainly hope these cases are not serious and that they do not directly impact school staff or students; however, we know they may and we need to be prepared with a plan that is based on guidance from public health experts.

Last November, the district distributed a COVID-19 Toolkit, which can be found on our website at https://bit.ly/3tVZia7. This document outlines the process for responding to positive cases of COVID-19. In combination with guidance from the San Juan County Department of Health & Community Services, it will determine how we respond to infections in or connected to the school when/if they occur. In this way, we hope to avoid arbitrary disruptions to student learning and family schedules.

In last week's letter I shared with you that we have been selected to participate in the 2nd cohort of the *Learn to Return Testing Program*, sponsored by the Washington State Department of

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Health. This initiative will provide free and easy access to COVID-19 tests for staff and students.

This week, our contact for *Return to Learn Testing* met with Nurse Hattman and me to review program details and timelines. Based on their recommendations, we will start by offering tests to school staff (with or without symptoms) and those students in school who are experiencing symptoms. As we become more experienced with the process, we hope to expand this service to all students regardless of whether they are symptomatic. Of course no student will be tested without the permission of their parent or guardian. We plan to begin *Learn to Return Testing* during the week of March 1.

While testing is an important part of our restart plan, we all know that vaccines are what will truly begin to improve the landscape. Our School Board, the teacher's union, and I, along with many others have advocated at the state level for school employees to be moved up the vaccine priority list, as they have been in many states. That has not happened and, according to health department officials, until the supply of vaccines is increased, changing the priority of school staff would make little practical difference. There is some evidence the supply is improving. Regardless, we will continue to advocate for all staff to have access to a vaccine.

That's all for this week.


Parent Partner Program News from Rachel Post


"On the set" of a film short for Parent Partner Cinematography class: director on camera in the salal, actor in character, and action!
